Course Title: Nurturing a Sense of Wonder Through Nature, Science and Engineering

Number of Credits: 3 graduate or undergraduate credits

Level: Graduate & Undergraduate

Students may elect to take this course at the undergraduate level. If so, some assignments and expectations for scholarly writing (paper page length, APA expectations) will be minimized to the level of complexity for what would be expected of an undergraduate student. Any adjustments to course expectations for this purpose should be determined collaboratively by the instructor and the student(s).

Course Code: EDU 5515 C13 (graduate) & EDU 4710 CFS14 (undergraduate)

Dates: July 20 – November 1, 2021.

This course is part of the 2021 Early Childhood Educators Institute and requires attendance all 4 days of the online institute July 20, 22, 27 & 29. The course continues in an online environment until November 1, 2021 at the latest.

Format: Online asynchronously and synchronously using Zoom videoconferencing.

Course Description:

Through guided hands-on activities that can be done both synchronously and asynchronously, engaging use of digital tools, dynamic conversations and helpful resources that can be implemented right way, this course will help participants embed nature, engineering and science education into their curriculum. This STEM-focused course will provide practical tips, sample activities and resources for facilitating

nature play, engineering and science activities, as well as help participants gain confidence in identifying common plants and animals.

Audience: Teachers of toddlers and Pre-k students

Course Goals:

Upon successful completion of this course, participants will know the skills needed to facilitate nature play, science investigations and engineering activities in their classrooms.

Course Objectives:

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

Use facilitation techniques to successfully guide engineering activities in their classroom or outside.

Demonstrate an understanding of the role of loose parts through incorporating nature play activities in the curriculum

Explain the importance of fostering a classroom environment rich in STEM learning.

Required Readings/Texts: (required texts not included in the course tuition)

Provided during the course as PDFs and online articles

Assignments:

Assignments for this course include daily prompts posted for reflection and discussion and daily hands-on activities to be completed asynchronously. Documentation of completed activities will take place on Jamboard. Participants will be expected to video themselves teaching, and submit a self-reflection, as well as a final reflection essay on implementation and practice.

Evaluation:

Participants are expected to participate fully in each day of the institute, including having video on during the virtual components. Evaluation of completed activities, video recording, reflections and posts will utilize the grading rubric.
